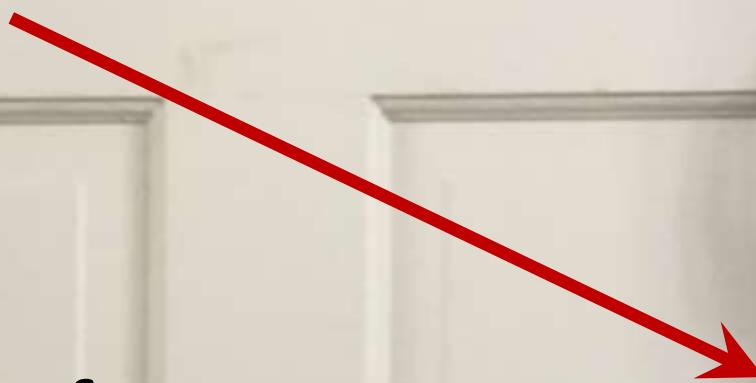

Hacking the SAA program

- Plenary sessions = full (everyone in a big room)
 - Keynotes, awards, etc.
- Concurrent sessions = at the same time
 - “Shop” names, affiliations, keywords, topics
 - Have an A pick and a B pick (and maybe a C)
- Section meetings = business + focused content
- Committees and working groups = members
- Networking groups = for anyone up that early
- Expo hall = vendors, free stuff, poster sessions

General conference conduct

- **Show up.** Go to stuff.
- Talk to people. As many as possible.
- Ask questions (if and when you have them).
- If you're tweeting, use the hashtags.
- Think about levelling up.
 - This year: volunteer for a committee or project?
 - Next year: submit a proposal/present?
 - Five years: run for a leadership position?

The tote bag

- Cardigan, hoodie, or wrap
- Water bottle
- Mints or gum
- Snacks!
- Notebook or notepad
- A good pen for you
- Crappy pens for extra
- Business cards (use badge!)
- Phone/laptop chargers
- Emergency power supply
- Flash drive
- Tissues (or a hankie, hand sanitizer, wipes, etc.)

*The conference is a wilderness!
This is your survival gear.*

Self-care strategies

- Eat, sleep, and drink water.
- Wash your hands.
- Check in with yourself from time to time.
- Check in with friends or a “conference buddy,” too.
- Going to everything **≠** being productive. Downtime is good.
